

## **Jenny's Blood Cries for Justice**

May 17, 2012 the six year old Jenny Patricia Yuquilema Atupaña was brutally raped and assassinated in Monte Sinaí, Guayaquil, Ecuador.

The act happened when Jenny's mother, Maria Aurora Atupaña Condure, went to a store close to her home. She did not realize that her daughter followed her out. When she returned to her home, she asked her husband, Narciso Yuquilema Buñay, where she was, but he could not find her. The two left to search the neighborhood. After many hours had passed, they found their daughter, dead, thrown in the middle of a home being constructed with signs of rape.

Three days later, May 20, 2012, the Judicial Police stopped the suspect Francisco Roberto de la Cruz Cortez. Cortez was known as "One-Eyed," a 28 year old who was identified by neighbors in the neighborhood of Monte Sinaí.

This act has caused uproar among the Ecuadorian community, mobilizing action among citizens and the President of Ecuador, Rafael Correa, who sympathized with the family.

Jenny's parents are immigrant workers from an indigenous province. They confess the Christian faith and live in the most recent urban settlements on the outskirts of Guayaquil.

Currently, Peace and Hope - Ecuador (Paz y Esperanza - Ecuador) has legal control of the case. For this motive, we ask that you join the family in consistent prayer, with the goal of seeking justice for Jenny. Please participate in the movement to reassign different aspects of this case to the corresponding authorities.
